# MINING MUSEUM

This reconstructed salt mine is located in what used to be Archduke Ferdinand II's residence. Journey through the winding tunnels to experience what life must have been like for the men underground. Original tools, mine cars, salt stones, crystals and lots more take you back to the Golden Age of salt mining and the very beginnings of the history of Hall.

### 4 CASTLE HASEGG – HALL MINT MUSEUM

(1,5 HOURS)

Hall's Mint Museum in Hasegg Castle delves into those bygone days when wealth was measured with real coins, when money still had a magical shine and currency was as hard as the material it was made of. From the Mint Tower, the landmark of Hall, you can enjoy a splendid view of the Hall-Wattens region.


